<p>Breath/blood test failure</p>	<p>90 days if no alcohol-related contact within 10 years of arrest date (§524.022) One year if previous alcohol-related contact within 10 years (§524.022) and a waiting period before the occupational license can take effect in the following situations: * 90 days if a previous suspension within five years of arrest (§521.251(b)); * 180 days if a previous suspension for DWI, intoxication assault or intoxication manslaughter conviction within five years of arrest (§521.251(c)); or * one year if a previous suspension for second or subsequent conviction for DWI, intoxication assault, or intoxication manslaughter within 5 years of arrest (§521.251(c)) For offenders under 21: First alcohol-related contact: 60 days (waiting period of 30 days) (§524.022) Second alcohol-related contact: 120 days (waiting period of 90 days) (§524.022) Third alcohol-related contact: 180 days (no occupational license at all) (§524.022)</p>
<p>Breath/blood test refusal</p>	<p>180 days (724.035) Two years if previous alcohol-related contact within 10 years (§724.035) and a waiting period before the occupational license can take effect in the following situations: * 90 days if a previous suspension within five years of arrest (§521.251(b)); * 180 days if a previous suspension for DWI, intoxication assault, or intoxication manslaughter conviction within five years of arrest (§521.251(c)); or * one year if a previous suspension for second or subsequent conviction for DWI, intoxication assault or intoxication manslaughter within five years of arrest (§521.251(c)).</p>

<p>Criminal mischief</p>	<p>One year (§521.320)</p>
<p>Criminally negligent homicide</p>	<p>One year (§521.343)</p>
<p>Driver's license fraud</p>	<p>90 days to one year (§§521.346, 521.451, 521.453)</p>
<p>DUI</p>	<p>One year (§521.343)</p>
<p>DWI (first offense)</p>	<p>Not probated: 90 days to one year (§521.344) Offender under 21 and not probated: one year (§521.344) Offender under 21 and probated: 90 days if ignition interlock made a condition of probation; one year if ignition interlock is not made a condition of probation [CCP 42.12 §13(n)]</p>
<p>DWI (second offense)</p>	<p>180 days to two years (§521.344) plus ignition interlock (§521.246) (One to two years if offense committed within five years of previous offense and a waiting period of one year) (§521.251(d))</p>
<p>DWI (third or greater offense)</p>	<p>180 days to two years (§521.344) plus ignition interlock (§521.246) (One to two years if offense committed within five years of previous offense and a waiting period of 1 year) (§521.251(d))</p>
<p>Driving with a suspended license</p>	<p>Same as previous suspension period (§521.343(c))</p>
<p>Evading arrest</p>	<p>One year (§521.341; §521.343)</p>
<p>Fictitious plates, registration, or inspection</p>	<p>180 days (§521.3465)</p>
<p>Fleeing</p>	<p>90 days (§521.292 (a)(10) and 545.421)</p>
<p>Failure to stop and render aid</p>	<p>One year (§521.341; §521.343)</p>
<p>Intoxication assault</p>	<p>First offense: 90 days to one year Second or subsequent offense within five years: one year (§521.344)</p>
<p>Intoxication manslaughter</p>	<p>180 days to two years (§521.344)</p>
<p>Marijuana/controlled substance possession</p>	<p>180 days (§521.372)</p>
<p>Racing on highway</p>	<p>One year plus 10 hours of community service * can be reinstated after completion of community service * no reinstatement for convictions within one year of previous conviction For offenders under 18: One year plus 10 hours of community service and occupational license restricted to going to and from an educational facility (§521.350)</p>
<p>Tampering with government records</p>	<p>One year (§521.3466, 521.343)</p>
